Now, you may have one less thing to worry about. Mississippi has a health insurance program for infants, children and teens. The insurance is available to children in working families, including families that include individuals with a variety of immigration status.

Families displaced by Hurricane Katrina may now be eligible for coverage. Take a moment to see if your family qualifies! You must apply before January 30, 2006, for eligibility. Don't delay!

This holiday season, take a few minutes to find out if your child is eligible for free or low-cost health insurance. Children who have health insurance generally have better health throughout their childhood and into their teens. They are more likely to:

- Receive needed shots that prevent disease;

- Get preventative care to keep them well;
- Get sick less often; and
- Get the treatment they need when they are sick.

All income is tested against gross income – no deductions are allowed. Compare gross income to the limit for the family size for families & children groups; compare gross income to the limit for an individual or couple limit for aged, blind & disabled groups.
